In October 2013, the Metro lost an important arts advocate and supporter, Erin Koffler. What made Erin such a terrific arts ally was that she contributed vital dollars to arts organizations, purchased work from local artists, and also attended arts openings and performances. She was an arts fan – and an arts champion. Her enthusiasm for the arts was contagious.

After Erin's death, her husband Monte Koffler set up a fund to honor Erin's memory by allocating dollars each year toward support of an artist through the Individual Arts Partnership Grants. The fund is sustained by regular contributions from her husband, friends and colleagues.
